


Regular Activates that Repeat or Rotate each year include

SUPPORTING YOUR CADET



- Help them organize their schedule so there is time for schoolwork, Navy League, and other activities
- Provide them with the tools to care for their uniform on a weekly basis
- Add Navy League activities to your family calendar
- Avoid conflicts with major activities (i.e. Annual Inspection)
- Encourage them to participate in corps events the more they put into their cadet experience, the more they get out of it!
- Fundraise to meet your family's monthly commitment – additional funds go to your family account
